

The following is an example of how these part settings of the modal psalm tones are used. It must be realized that the style of notation *does not* imply a metric treatment of the psalm tones and text, but rather an interpretation and performance based on word/text rhythm just as in the performance of the unison modal psalm tones. The first note of each psalm tone is to be seen as a note of indefinite value depending on the line being sung. Those notes with the fermata are to indicate cadences.


